12. NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS AND OTHER MEETINGS

During the year the Association purchased racking equipment to enable competitors to attend the Barbados World Championships. This racking has been treated as a fixed asset in anticipation of potential future earnings and future use by the Association of this equipment. This results in a book profit in the current year of £6,689, which otherwise would be £920 had the equipment not been treated as a fixed asset.
