Minutes of the 69th Annual General Meeting held 5th August 2019 at South Caernarvonshire Yacht Club.

Persons present: 33 members attended the meeting, a full list of their names is filed with these minutes. Apologies were received from Paul Bowmer, Hugh Brazier, Mark Collingwood, Oliver Shaw, Mandy Mitchell and Ian Foulkes.

1. President's welcome.

Ann Penny opened the meeting at 20.10 and welcomed all attendees. A minute's silence was then held in memory of the lives of Eddie Ramsden and Searson Thompson who passed away in July 2019.

2. Minutes of the 68th Annual General Meeting.

The draft minutes had been placed on the association's web site for 11 months and copies were provided to the meeting. There were no comments received.

3. Secretary's Report.

4. Treasurer's Report and Accounts.

Attendees were provided with copies of a written report prepared by Paul Bowmer together with copies of the certified accounts for the year to 30th September 2018. Ann briefly summarized the report on behalf of Paul, noting in particular his recommendation that subscriptions be raised slightly for the coming year. Ann thanked Paul for his work and support over the year.

5. Membership fees.

6. Appointment of Accountants.

Motion: To re-appoint Sergents as the Association's Accountants for the coming year.

Proposed: Adam Chaplin. Seconded: Charles Saunders. Vote: Carried unanimously by a show of hands.

7. Proposed motion to change the Constitution.

Explanation:

Our Trustees are appointed on a 'for life' basis and with the passing of the years it is becoming clear that this may lead to difficulties if and when infirmity becomes an issue. The Finance and General Purposes Committee therefore

propose that the number of Trustees be increased by one and that the new appointee should of significantly younger age than the current group. Proposal:

That the opening paragraph of clause 10 of the constitution be changed from: Trustees – There shall be four Trustees of the Association, any three of whom may act. The first Trustee shall be appointed at an Annual General Meeting. To:

Trustees – There shall be five Trustees of the Association, any three of whom may act. The first Trustee shall be appointed at an Annual General Meeting. Reason for proposal:

To enable right governance of the Association to continue in the event of two Trustees becoming unable to act at any one time.

Proposed: Ann Penny. Seconded: Stephen Parry

The proposal was considered and it was agreed that General Committee should be asked to bring forward proposals for further revision of the constitution to remove the life-time status of our Trustees and place the appointments on a 5 year, renewable, basis.

Motion: to accept the recommended changes made by the Finance and General Purposes Committee and to ask General Committee to consider bringing forward a further change to the tenure arrangements for trusteeship as outlined above.

Proposed: Hugh Gill.

Seconded: Ian Dobson.

Vote: Carried unanimously by a show of hands.

8. Election of Officers.

It was noted with regret that the recently formed branch in Barbados was no longer in Association membership, albeit that GP14s are still being sailed in that country.

11. Hand over by the president.

Curly Morris presented Ann Penny with the Past President's jewel and expressed his huge gratitude on behalf of the Association for all that Ann had done for the Class. Curly told the meeting how much he looked forward to taking on the role of President and explained why he felt a particular affection for the GP14. Emphasising the importance of the boat's international status, Curly briefly outlined the challenges that lie ahead in supporting our overseas branches in the replenishing of their fleets.

Ann Penny gave the following speech in response:

It has been an honour to be President of the Association. The GP14 has played an important part in my life over the past 20 years. I have met so many wonderful people both at my home club of Derwent Reservoir S.C. and of course, through travelling on 'the circuit'. It was for this reason that Duncan Greenhalgh asked me to come onto Committee as Vice President. Not just for my sailing talents, but for my enthusiasm, which has not waned whilst being on Committee.
